Ethics – A Perspective for The Practice of Esoteric Healing

There are differences of opinions in the world about what is right and wrong on almost any issue. With Esoteric Healing, the use of ethics is important not only when working with the energetics of another person but in creating our part in right human relationships. I would like to address for the next article the first ethics statement listed from the NAEH Code of Ethics for practitioners. "Demonstrate commitment to provide the highest-quality Esoteric Healing to those who seek out their Esoteric Healing care."

Reading through the list of ethics statements to write these articles, this one caught my attention and I thought of this particular client. This gentleman with whom I have been working for a number of years has made quite a gain in healing but can be a very difficult client to work with.

We got together a short while ago, had a session and planned out several additional treatment sessions due to a new condition that was a result of a medical procedure. All fine and well, right? Well, he cancelled via text message three days before the appointed next session. OK, these things happen – it is part of the nature of the business.

The problem comes in when it happens all too often. I used to get irritated and my little personality ego would puff up and I would think "well, I just won't work on him anymore!" Then he calls and needs another appointment, I agree, and this one he actually gets there and, lo and behold – on time!

So, how can I honor my commitment to provide a high-quality session when I get so darn miffed at him? I find myself going back and forth with do I give up on him and tell him I am done or do I see him again and try to set my anger aside?

There are as many different ways to look at this as there are practitioners. One thing is where are your boundaries? How far in advance do you need to be notified of a cancellation? What about a no-show? Personally, I need to set my boundaries and create a cancellation policy. This needs to be fair to me and to my clients.

Then there is the question of what is the highest and best for the client? Is there something we can help with if we give more time? Do we need to discuss the "being late issue?" Could there be a breakthrough? So many questions.

The clients' energy field, emotional, mental and spiritual can and will give us some clues we can use to help in our decision of what do I do with this person! Each client has different healing

needs. What are their rays? What is best for you and your client? Can you give a high quality Esoteric Healing session?

For this particular client, through meditation I heard, "See him as a Soul and honor the Soul. His personality is afraid." I realize each session of Esoteric Healing helps in ways we might not see on a physical level but can sense benefit on another level. Hopefully with time a connection between his personality and Soul will develop. As long as I can focus on his Soul and leave my personality ego out of the picture, I will continue to accept working with this man – for the benefit of both of us.
